

POSITION ANNOUNCEMENT

Outpatient Mental Health/Dual Diagnosis Therapist

Family Service of the Piedmont is a not for profit agency whose mission is to promote healthy lives and relationships for children, families and individuals, through early intervention, treatment and support in times of crisis or transition.

The agency is seeking a Outpatient Mental Health/Dual Diagnosis Therapist to provide individual, group and family therapy to a diverse population, including outpatient substance abuse treatment.

Responsibilities:

- 1. Provides quality, culturally sensitive, respectful treatment services to a diverse population by using individual, family and group modalities.
- 2. Documents all treatment services by formulating assessment and treatment plans, writing progress notes and transfer/termination summaries and completing other documentation as required by agency, funder and ethical standards. Documentation is to be completed per Agency policy.
- 3. Maintains harmonious relationships with community organizations by providing professional liaison concerning specific cases when indicated, and by providing consultation and advocacy when appropriate.
- 4. Maintains positive relationships with agency and team staff by contributing to team cohesiveness, by consulting and collaborating with other staff as needed, and by fostering an atmosphere of tolerance of cultural and lifestyle differences.
- 5. Seeks/maintains licensure through continuing education experiences as required.

Qualifications:

- 1. Dual Licensure strongly preferred LCSW/LCAS or LCAS-A preferred or LCSW with TF-CBT Certification strongly preferred.
- 2. The ability to respond appropriately to the cultural differences present among the organization's service population and staff is required.
- 3. Ability to work in partnership with other team members.
- 4. Ability to forge a mutually respectful partnership with persons served and their families in which they are helped to gain the skills and confidence to address any issues and problems they face.
- 5. Conviction about the capacity of people to grow and change.
- 6. Ability to set limits and maintain the helping role of the practitioner and to intervene appropriately to meet the needs of the persons served or other family members.
- 7. Clinical training in Integrated Dual Diagnosis Treatment preferred.
- 8. Master's degree in social work, counseling, or related field.
