Healthy Start In-Home Therapist January 22, 2018

Family Service of the Piedmont is a not for profit agency whose mission is to promote healthy lives and relationships for children, families and individuals, through early intervention, treatment and support in times of crisis or transition.

The agency is seeking a Healthy Start In-Home Therapist to provide assessment, consultation, individual, family and group therapy to a diverse client population an office, home, or other community setting.

Responsibilities:

- 1. Provide quality, culturally sensitive, respectful treatment services to a diverse clientele by conducting sessions in their homes and communities. This position requires providing Healthy Start families with assessment, consultation, and counseling services.
- 2. Must work professionally with community collaboratives as needed (the Department of Social Services, Guardian ad litem office and the school system).
- 3. Documents all treatment services by formulating assessment and treatment plans, writing progress reports, termination summaries, outcome evaluation documentation, and completing other documentation as required by agency and ethical standards.
- 4. Maintain harmonious relationship with community organizations by providing professional liaison concerning specific cases, by providing consultation and advocacy when appropriate, by promoting the expansion of the Healthy Start program and model and by representing the agency in assigned community projects and professional organizations.
- 5. Participates in Family Preservation/Healthy Start therapy team by completing other activities, duties or assignments that may be needed for effective agency functioning.
- 6. Maintains positive relationships with agency and team staff by contributing to team cohesiveness, fostering an atmosphere of tolerance for cultural and lifestyle differences and consulting and collaborating with other staff.
- 7. Maintains expected caseload of clients as needed for overall team functioning.
- 8. Completes all Medicaid required paperwork to bill for families when necessary.
- 9. Completes all necessary documentation to obtain/maintain clinical licensure.

Qualifications:

- 1. The ability to respond appropriately to the cultural differences present among the organization's service population and staff is required.
- 2. Ability to work in partnership with other team members.
- 3. Ability to forge a mutually respectful partnership with persons served and their families in which they are helped to gain the skills and confidence to address any issues and problems they face.
- 4. Conviction about the capacity of people to grow and change.
- 5. Ability to set limits and maintain the helping role of the practitioner and to intervene appropriately to meet the needs of the persons served or other family members.
- 6. Master's degree and licensure or license-eligible in social work, counseling, or related field.
